

Minutes of the Village of Holland Council Meeting
Held Tuesday, April 20, 2021

At 7:30 pm Mayor Irons called the meeting to order. Starting tonight, meetings have returned to the Holland Municipal Building, live, with Covid-19 protocols in place such as face masks, plexiglass barriers, HEPA air filters and social distancing. Councilmembers Scott Brown, Terry Nachtrab, Mike Bettinger, President Ryan Spangler, Roger Burditt, Chad Smith and Clerk-Treasurer Lyn Krasula and Village Attorney Paul Skaff were all present.

Mr. Burditt made a motion to approve the minutes from the 4/6/2021 council meeting as presented by the Clerk-Treasurer. Mr. Bettinger seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Mayor Irons announced this year’s council summer session meeting dates as June 15, July 13 and August 10. Mr. Spangler made a motion to confirm the dates. Mr. Browns seconded the motion with roll call

Mayor Irons reported that the Police Committee is continuing to review the new Lexipol police department rules and regulations updates. Mr. Brown stated that the Police Committee and the Wage & Hiring Committee have both reviewed the new Chapter 1 of the revised police department rules and regulations. Mr. Brown made a motion to approve Chapter 1 of the revised police department rules and regulations as presented. Mr. Spangler seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Mayor Irons gave brief updates regarding the following:

- Toledo Edison has advised that the large tree the Village lights for Christmas at Angola and McCord can no longer be decorated with lights due to its close proximity to existing overhead power lines;
- The open house for the Holloway Road and Hamilton Drive road reconstruction projects were very poorly attended by both residents and businesses alike. The Village has been receiving lots of phone calls from those who did not attend requesting information. The projects are scheduled to start on May 3;
- Spring leaf pickup starts on Monday and will continue through May 7;
- The Republic refuse / recycling collection trucks continue to leak hydraulic fluid during their collection routes in the Village, staining the streets. Republic did attempt to clean up one time with a street sweeper, but has not made any attempts lately, Mr. Bettinger suggested reporting the leaks to the EPA.

Mr. Spangler made a motion to approve payment of bills totaling \$535,255.03 as distributed by the Clerk-Treasurer. Mr. Bettinger seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.
