## Minutes of the Village of Holland Council Meeting Held Tuesday, December 13, 2022

At 7:30 pm Mayor Lee Irons called the meeting to order. Councilmembers Scott Brown, Justin Hoen, Mike Bettinger, President Ryan Spangler, Roger Burditt, Nathan Gaubert, Clerk-Treasurer Lyn Krasula and Village Attorney Paul Skaff were all present.

Mr. Bettinger made a motion to approve the minutes from the 11/15/22 council meeting as presented by the Clerk-Treasurer. Mr. Gaubert seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Ms. Krasula requested approval of a 2023 purchase order for the annual CMI software support contract, less the income tax portion. The tax software will be eliminated next year as approved by the Budget / Finance committee, as RITA now has over 7 years of tax history available. Mr. Spangler made a motion to authorize a PO in 2023 to CMI for \$10,714.15 as requested. Mr. Brown seconded the motion with motion carrying six ayes.

Mayor Irons appointed Richard Smoot as a police officer, contingent upon the completion of a physical exam which will determine his start date, plus his lateral transfer position will be determined based upon certification from his current employer on years of full-time service, which will determine his pay rate. Mr. Brown made a motion to confirm the Mayor's appointment. Mr. Spangler seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes. Attorney Skaff then administered the Oath of Office to officer Smoot.

Ms. Krasula reviewed change order number 1 for the Hall Street Resurfacing project as submitted by Tim Bock. The change is a deduction in the cost of the contract in the amount of \$8,409.10 which was due to a reduction in final quantities. Mr. Bettinger made a motion to approve the change order. Mr. Hoen seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Mr. Spangler made a motion to suspend regular rules of council to allow Ordinance No. 27-2022 to be read by title only. Mr. Burditt seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes. First reading of Ordinance No. 27-2022, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE RE-ENACTMENT OF CERTAIN SECTIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 25 & 26-2022, was read by title only. Mr. Spangler made a motion to suspend regular rules of council to dispense with the second and third readings. Mr. Gaubert seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes. Mr. Spangler made a motion to approve passage of the ordinance on its first and final reading. Mr. Brown seconded the motion will roll call carrying six ayes.

Mr. Spangler informed council that Plan Commission did discuss the recent fire damage to the building at 6841Angola Road. Mr. Spangler made a motion to direct the administrative assistant to contact a commercial appraiser to obtain a report for the building portion that was damaged. If the damaged portion exceeds 60% of fair market value of the structure, if rebuilt, the building must meet current zoning code regulations. Mr. Gaubert seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Mr. Brown made a motion to approve the cost of new uniforms for new hire Smoot at a cost not to exceed \$3,000. Mr. Spangler seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Mayor Irons reported that he has been advised by both Columbia Gas and Buckeye Cable of pending rate increases effective 1/1/2023.

After review, Mr. Bettinger made a motion to approve payment of bills totaling \$69,888.59 as distributed by the Clerk-Treasurer. Mr. Burditt seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

Mr. Bettinger made a motion to authorize the Clerk-Treasurer to pay bills through year end upon review and approval by the Mayor. Mr. Burditt seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes.

At 7:45, the zoning public hearing was called to order. Mr. Spangler reviewed a PUD request made by Jiffy Lube for 1411 S McCord Road. Plan Commission did review the request and is recommending approval. This includes approval of the PUD which will include designating the property as a planned unit development and relaxing setbacks to 25' front yard, 5' side and a zero-rear setback for additional structures on the property. Mr. Spangler explained that Jiffy Lube is projecting one additional building on the lot in the future. Mr. Bettinger asked how many buildings are planned? Mr. Spangler answered 3 including the future development. The third building will come back to Plan Commission for review. Mr. Bettinger asked if the setbacks meet fire code? Mr. Spangler responded yes. No one was present in the audience for the public hearing. Mr. Spangler made a motion, based upon Plan Commissions recommendations, for approval of the PUD and the relaxing of the setbacks for additional structures. Mr. Bettinger seconded the motion with roll call carrying six ayes. The zoning public hearing was then closed.

Mr. Bettinger reported that a couple of the maintenance department trucks were in for significant repairs. Mr. Spangler reviewed the 2022 Administrative Assistant annual report.

There being no further business, at 7:55 p.m. Mr. seconded the motion. Motion carried six ayes.	Burditt made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Spangler
