

Minutes of the Village of Holland Council Meeting Held Tuesday, May 21, 2024

At 6:05 pm Mayor Spangler called the meeting to order. Council members, Sandy Almond, Mike Bettinger, Council President Scott Brown, and Justin Hoen were in attendance. Village Administrator Bob Bethel and Acting Clerk-Treasurer Leslie Ferman were also in attendance. Nate Gaubert, Sandy Hensley and Village Attorney Paul Skaff were absent.

Mr. Bettinger made a motion to approve the minutes of May 7, 2024, as presented with Mr. Brown second. Roll call carried four ayes.

Discussion on two choices for the Village motto was held. Choices are: “What Holland has been is nothing compared to what it will be!” and “On the right track”. Mr. Bettinger made motion to select “On the right track” with Mr. Brown second. Roll call carried four ayes.

First reading of Ordinance 23-2024, AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE RE-ENACTMENT OF CERTAIN SECTIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 14, 15, 17, 18 & 19, 2024 was read in its entirety by Mayor Spangler.

Chief Piotrowski updated the Council on two recent incidents that are currently under investigation by the police department. Chief Piotrowski also updated the Council on the progress of the police candidate currently in the Ohio Peace Officer Academy.

Mr. Bethel presented his Administrator’s report advising that IT transition from Perry Protech Tech to Triotech is ongoing, announced that the proposed Whisperwood road project has been funded and is in design and engineering phase, McCord Road pre-construction meeting to be held June 4 and met with Village and County officials regarding proposed grant funding for several road projects including Angola Road from Whisperwood to I-475 overpass, and Clark Street; and use of AARPA funds for proposed Kipling and Springfield Drive projects. These projects all in the pre-planning stages. Mr. Bethel also advised that training on implementation of the Text MyGov program has been scheduled. This program allows for better communication between the Village, its residents and business community.

Mr. Brown made a motion to pay the bills as presented with Mrs. Almond second. Roll call carried four ayes.
