

**VILLAGE OF HOLLAND, LUCAS COUNTY, OHIO
ORDINANCE NO. 29-2024**

AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CLERK-TREASURER TO CREATE AN OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND WITHIN THE ESTABLISHED FINANCIAL AND BUDGETARY ACCOUNTING SYSTEM FOR THE PURPOSE OF SEGREGATING FUNDS RECEIVED AND EXPENDED FOR THE ONEOHIO OPIOID SETTLEMENTS.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has reached settlement agreements with several distributors of opioids; and

WHEREAS, the State has developed the OneOhio plan, a mechanism to ensure that any money from negotiated settlements is distributed fairly to communities hit by the opioid crises; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the OneOhio settlement funding will be distributed to the Village of Holland; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Holland does not currently have an established special revenue fund that would meet this criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF HOLLAND, LUCAS COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The Clerk-Treasurer is hereby authorized to establish within the financial accounting system a Special Revenue fund entitled Opioid Settlement Fund for the purpose of collection and distribution of the Village's portion of the OneOhio negotiated opioid funding.

SECTION 2. The Clerk-Treasurer shall request an Amended Certificate of Estimated Resources from the Lucas County Auditor's Office to include this new Opioid Settlement special revenue Fund.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code of Ohio.
